**orrect Reimbursements From Medicare, Managed Care & Indemnity Payers**

- G0275 and G0278 are mandatory for Medicare patients with heart cath.
- In cardiology, a STENT (92980) and PTCA/Angioplasty (92982) that are performed in the same vessel, such as the LAD, at the same session are not billable together in any setting. However, in "non-coronary" vessels, like renals and iliacs, there are situations in which it is possible to bill for a STENT& a PTA during the same session. Learn the appropriate settings in which this is okay to bill and get paid.
- Code and document for what you do; perfect documentation that will get you paid.
- Modifiers are your key to reimbursement. Dealing with the latest definition of the -59 modifier could impact an increase or decrease in your revenue. We'll also explore Peripheral Cardiology's use of them all.
- Many interventional procedure codes and definitions for 2006 have been modified. We'll update you on the latest for 2009.
- Medicare's Physician Fee Schedule is here. PV has been hard hit. We will give you the updates.

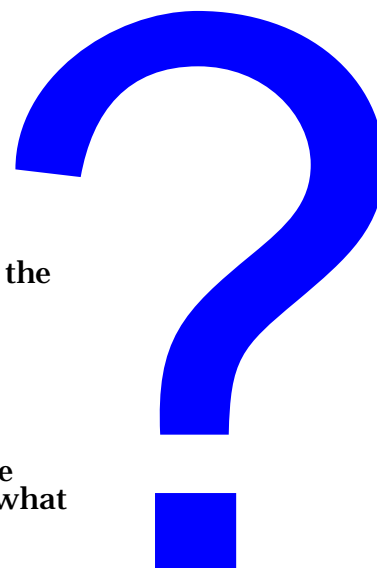
